LA VETA TRAILS

Please use caution when walking on streets and alleyways where motor vehicles are present.

1. LA VETA LOOP TRAIL 향송 🏠 🏥

Trail Length: 3 miles | Difficulty: Easy to Moderate Modest elevation gain on La Veta streets and alleyways with exceptional views of the Spanish Peaks, Sangre de Cristo Mounain Range, and Greenhorn Mountain.

Trail access: Parking is available at the Town Park. Restroom is open in the summer season.

2. TOWN CENTER TRAIL

Trail Length: 1 mile | Difficulty: Easy

This 1 mile trail is on La Veta sidewalks that will take you by the Town's most historic buildings, shops, restaurants, galleries, and the library. Please use caution when crossing intersections.

Trail access: Parking is available at the Town Park. Restroom is open in the summer season.

3. SCHOOL NATURE TRAIL

Trail Length: .25 miles | Difficulty: Easy

Loop trail with crusher fine surface. Slight rise to the painted benches. The trail meanders through the park, passing information kiosks and plant identification markers. There is a beautiful view of the park and Mt. Maestas.

Trail access: Parking is available on the southeast corner of E. Garland St. and Birch St.

WAHATOYA STATE WILDLIFE AREA

A valid Colorado hunting or fishing license OR State Wildlife Pass is required for everyone 16 or older accessing this state wildlife area.

4. WAHATOYA LAKE TRAIL

Trail Length: 1 mile | Difficulty: Easy to Moderate Loop trail with natural surface. The trail meanders through fields, woods, and a berm on the north side that offers a beautiful view of the Spanish Peaks and Mt. Maestas.

Trail access: Drive east on Francisco St. Road bears to the right. The parking area will be on your left. *Bicycles are not allowed.*

5. DAIGRE LAKE TRAIL

Trail Length: 1 mile | Difficulty: Easy to Moderate Loop trail with natural surface that encircles Daigre Reservoir. The trail traverses on the top of a berm on the south side and through woods on the north side with stunning views of the Spanish Peaks and Mt. Maestas.

Trail access: Drive east on Moore Ave for about one mile to the parking area on the left. *Bicycles are not allowed.*

Trail Etiquette

- Pick up after your dog.
- Dogs must be on a leash.
- Carry out your trash.
- Stay on the trail. Protect flora and fauna, prevent soil erosion, and respect neighboring property owners.
